WHAT CAMERAS TO USE:

The higher quality the camera, the better, however we would be more than happy for pictures to be shot on your phone.

WHERE TO POST OR UPLOAD YOUR PICTURES & VIDEO

During the Concert for the Planet

You can post to the <u>Global Orchestra Facebook Page</u> during the event instantly from your phone or computer.

Here's how.

** If you already used Facebook and have liked the Global Orchestra Facebook page, GO TO STEP 3

- 1. Go to the website <u>Global Orchestra Facebook Page</u> or download the Facebook app onto your mobile device.
- 2. **Sign in** to your own facebook account **or create** one if you don't have one and **like** the Global Orchestra facebook page
- 3. Stay signed into your account during the event and live stream your video by clicking "Live" on your status bar.

- 4. Allow Facebook to access your camera and microphone, and your screen should change to camera mode.
- 5. THIS IS IMPORTANT: Tag the Global Orchestra Facebook Page and label your video or photo with #GOLIVE2018 #globalorchestra and #Connect2Earth on the textbox. This will ensure that images and videos appear on our page, whilst also appearing on your page. Add the location and description of the scene as well as a cool description of who you/ your group are. You can also use the drop down menu to map your location by using Facebook's geo-tagging feature.
- 6. Click the blue 'Start Live Video' button and begin streaming.
- 7. After the event, follow the prompts to **KEEP all live videos as a post** (denying these prompts may mean you lose the video stream altogether!)
- 8. Continue adding videos and photos with the hashtag #globalorchestra each time

After the Concert for the Planet

Please upload the high res unedited & uncompressed versions of your pictures and videos to the <u>Global Orchestra Dropbox</u>. We've love to be able to include you in our wrap video. If its too low-res, we won't be able to make out who you are!

Include a description with the contact information of the event and who took the photos/video so we can credit you properly and get in touch if needed.

We can then use these to compile a wonderful compilation video of the event to share with the world and inspire more people to get involved at the next event.

STILL PHOTOGRAPH IDEAS

- An individual musician in the foreground with Conductor Cam clearly seen from their POV.
- View back at ensemble from beside Conductor-cam, all the musicians faces looking up- waiting to play their part... or playing.
- Wide shot of the whole gathering

- Close ups of faces listening by candle light (look for a variety of faces that represent the breadth of the community.)
- Close ups of musicians concentrating, playing or waiting to play.
- A sign of the venue indicating where this event is being held. ie: the schools title board out front etc

VIDEO IDEAS

Pre-Concert

Time lapse of People gathering and setting up the space.

Pledges for the planet to camera. Individuals and/or groups addressing the camera, saying:

- Who you are: "I'm Charlie or/We're the Penguin Primary school..."
- Where are you: "... In Balmain, Sydney/Tasmania"
- What's your pledge for 2018?: "In 2018 I'm/we're going to... start composting at our school" (or whatever your plan is, as an individual or a community)
- What Instrument you are playing if you are:
- **Repeat the Call to action:** "What part will you play for the planet?"

Short interview with the organizers of the Global Orchestra satellite event. Ask them:

- Introduce yourself and where you are from.
- How did you hear about the Global Orchestra?
- What was appealing about the idea?
- How long have they been preparing?
- What's been the general feeling around the event and in the preparation?
- What are some of the outcomes you hope and event like this might achieve in your community

During the Concert

- Film any introductory speeches anyone might make.
- Short segments of musicians playing recognizable parts of "The Planets" to conductor-cam.
- Close ups or mid shots of people listening intently
- Capture applause and the energy at the end of the concert

Post-Concert

- Could do general vox pops on people's experience. Listeners and musicians.

VIDEO FILMING TECHNIQUES

- Put camera on tripod or hand hold steady.
- Please avoid moving shots or pans, they are hard to edit together. To change from one shot to the next just do it quickly, and settle on the next camera angle.
- For "to camera" pledges ask people to speak very loudly and clearly. If it's a big group and the camera is far away to fit them in, they may need to shout it. Remember the closer you are to the sound source the clearer you camera mic will pick it up.
